About the Alliance:

Job Description:

This temporary, part-time position (~10 hours per week) is responsible for providing project support to the Alliance's Virginia water quality monitoring staff on the RiverTrends project, including interacting with volunteers, administrative work, and occasional time in the field.

Specific Duties of the Position:

- Support Monitoring Equipment Maintenance and Management
 - Verify/calibrate equipment and organize it for storage as it arrives at the office.
 - Fill monitoring supply requests from volunteers
- Assist with new monitor and recertification trainings
 - o Prep equipment and supplies for trainings
 - Attend trainings as available (in person and virtual) to help answer questions and set up training
- Review water quality data submitted by volunteers and publish it on the Chesapeake Data Explorer
- Assist with online communications social media posts, newsletter articles, website updates, etc.

Supervision: The Intern will report directly to the Water Quality Monitoring Projects Coordinator.

Hours, Location, and Timeframe: The Water Quality Monitoring Intern will be based at the Alliance's Richmond, VA Office with occasional travel within Virginia. The position is part-time (~10 hours per week) from May-August with flexible start and end times. There is some flexibility to work remotely, but does require weekly time in the office during regular working hours, 9am to 5pm and occasional weekend hours. A consistent schedule for hours worked will be established between the Water Quality Monitoring Intern and the Water Quality Monitoring Initiative Director and Project Coordinator.
